ISLAND MEDIATOR RECEIVES NATIONAL AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

Charlottetown lawyer and mediator, Pamela Large Moran, has been awarded the Lionel J. MCGowan Award of Excellence in Dispute Resolution by the ADR Institute of Canada during its annual national conference recently held in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Established to pay tribute to a pioneer in the field of Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR), the award is given to an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to the development and success of the Regional Affiliate of the ADR Institute of Canada and has contributed significantly to the promotion and development of ADR within the region. The ADR Institute of Canada is the national association for over 1800 mediators and arbitrators across the country.

Large Moran practices as a mediator and arbitrator and provides consulting and training in the area of conflict management and conflict resolution through her company, Conflict Resolution Services (CRS) Atlantic. Prior to establishing her current ADR practice, Large Moran practiced as a civil and commercial litigator in Toronto for 10 years before returning to the Island in 2000.

She is past vice-president of the ADR Institute of Canada as well as past president of ADR Atlantic. She is presently PEI Chair on the Canadian Bar Associational National ADR Section. She has been a member of the Law Society of Upper Canada since 1991 and the Law Society of PEI since 1999.

Large Moran obtained her Law Degree (LL.B) from Dalhousie Law School in 1989, her Masters of Law in Alternative Dispute Resolution (LL.M ADR) from Osgoode Hall Law School in 2004 and her Chartered Mediator Designation (C.
